We are once again supplying the Christmas tree outside St Andrews Church in Sandon, and look forward to seeing you and Father Christmas at the lighting on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> December at 5 p.m., followed by hot chocolate and mince pies in the Church.

We are delighted that Rev. Terry Brown is back following his recent illness and looking well, wishing him all the best on his full recovery.

The Parish Community Outdoor Cinema Event in August of 'The Greatest Showman' was really successful. The Church, Bell Ringers, The Sports Club, and others, provided very tasty eats and drinks. We were fortunate in that the weather was very kind. Thank you to everyone who assisted in making this a great event.

A meeting was held for residents and users of The Sandon Hall Bridleway in Howe Green to discuss the possible replacement of the dangerous cracked concrete. Bretts Aggregates, who own the road, are proposing to repair this with Type 1 crushed concrete. The meeting was very well attended and some very useful suggestions were made. We will get Highways on board as footpath 22 runs down the centre of the Bridleway. Hopefully, they will get in touch with Bretts as well to ensure the surface is safe to walk on. Residents and users preferred to have the concrete repaired, rather than Bretts suggestion of crushed concrete, and emails have been sent to pass the results on to them from this meeting.

The Sandon Neighbourhood Development Plan is moving forward due to the enthusiasm of the residents' group. Policy documents have now been written and passed to Chelmsford for their comment. We are continuing to bring it to the attention to all parts of the community, from the Scouts/school children to WI/resident groups. The Parish Council would like to thank all those who attended and supported the event and made it a success. We would particularly like to thank The Friends of Sandon Church for the excellent barbecue they provided, the Church Choir for delicious tea and cake, Sandon Sports Club for the bar and not be forgotten, the Village Hall for the use of their facilities.

Thoughts are now turning to next year's event and we invite anyone with an idea for a community event to contact the council. We very much look forward to see you all next summer at our next event.



### FINANCIAL REPORT

Please remember that we are a non political body who make payments for various items. For example, we provide services i.e. Sandon Parish Council staff, and pay suppliers, on a regular basis. We also purchase new assets. We have recently bought a new "agile" grass mower which is more suited to the smaller areas that we service, as oppose to the thirteen year old large grass mower. We have replaced three dog 'poo' bins that have disappeared, or now have been deemed necessary. We also manage projects which can cost a large amount of money. The most recent concerns the allotment site. We are now owners of extra land behind the current site at the bottom of Hall Lane. We are planning to convert this into extra plots so as to reduce the waiting list for allotments that we have.

We pay for various organisations to train the Councillors and staff as required. For example, one of us went on an allotments course recently and learnt a lot, not only about agriculture, but also the rules we have to follow. We regularly have to pay fees to professional organisations such as the NALC and EALC. These are the national and local council bodies. Note that we are reviewing whether to join the more local CALC as well. We have to pay insurances on assets and vehicles, together with audit fees. Last year, we paid an internal professional auditor as required under the rules, as well as an external auditor. These cost a total of nearly £500.

Local council rules have changed and we are now "allowed" to "hire out" services that were previously illegal. However, this brings a lot of form filling and risk which we have talked about but not proceeded with at this time. Other regular payments include software updates, internet charges, website costs and security. Earlier this month, a window in the office was broken and had to be replaced. A one off cost again......

With regards to income, as well as the precept that you pay us via Chelmsford City Council, we receive rent from allotment holders and levies that CCC charge on housing and commercial developments. These are known as CIL monies, or Section 106 fees. For example, if a person is building a new house in the parish, then a certain percentage of this payment to the builder would go to CCC. They would then give this to us "to be spent on a range of projects that CCC agrees with". It is sometimes a long time coming! The clerk has a list of monies which are ring fenced for those projects that are eligible. The extension to the allotment site is one such project that can qualify for this CIL money.

### GET HELP IN APPLYING FOR UNIVERSAL CREDIT

Talking about money, there are certain residents in our parish that are struggling to make ends meet through no fault of their own. Christmas can be a particularly tough time. If you are on a low income, or know someone else who is, then please note that they may be eligible to apply for Universal Credit. Note that you may be entitled to this even if you are working. The idea behind U.C. is to raise your monthly income to a level that enables you to survive on a day to day basis. If you find the forms difficult to complete, or you would like more information about U.C., then Chelmsford Citizens Advice Bureau are keen to make everyone aware of the service that they can offer. Please see the below information that they have supplied to us:

Our Help to Claim service can support you in the early stages of your Universal Credit claim, from the application, through to your first payment. Help to Claim is a dedicated service from Citizens Advice. It's free, independent and confidential. Our trained advisers can help with things like how to gather evidence for your application or how to prepare for your work coach appointment.

### **ADULT MENTAL HEALTH TRAINING COURSE**



Sandon Parish Council facilitated a half day course on Saturday 23rd November in St Andrews Church Hall. This is part of an established programme being rolled out across the country by Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) England. Our facilitator, Michelle, gave us a useful introduction to some of the issues around mental health. The course is designed to help us pay attention to our own mental and emotional well being, thinking especially about some of the stressors in our lives. She introduced the idea of a stress container. The idea of this is to help us to identify our stresses but also to identify what helps us to cope with these, before it starts to impact adversely on our mental health. The concept of Taking Ten together toolkit is focused on helping us to start the conversation about mental health, either our own or someone we are close to or maybe someone we work with who may appear to be struggling in some way or is not quite themselves.

If you are interested in knowing more about mental health, this course is a good starter. Do contact Ted Munt at the Parish Council if you are interested in attending a course. If we have enough interest, then a further course can be arranged in the parish.



Thank you to all those who came along. We do hope that you will spread the message about the importance of looking after our mental health and may feel able to start a conversation with someone you have perhaps been worried about for a while.



The author was born at Sandon in February 1911 and educated at Great Baddow. In 1926 he joined the staff of the County Council at the Shire Hall, Chelmsford, and ten years later was made responsible for the preparation of the Electors' Lists and the Jurors Book for Essex and for the conduct of parliamentary elections in the eight County Constituencies.

When elections were suspended at the outbreak of war in 1939 the Home Office offered him the appointment of Clerk to the Government Referees on Evacuation. After two years in that office he joined the Royal Navy and while serving in the Mediterranean as a Lieutenant-Commander in May 1945 he was urgently summoned home to supervise, in Essex, the forthcoming general election.

Retiring in 1974, he was recalled in the following year to work with the Home Office in planning the Referendum, and then to organise and conduct the Referendum and the count for the whole of Essex.



In 1950 he married Margaret (Peggy) Mott and they took up residence at Graces Cross, where they spent the next thirty-three years. They have two children, Anthony (John) and Diana, and four grandchildren.
